Spiritual Thought

This weekend we begin again the church's year, with Advent, the royal season.

For many Catholics Advent is their favourite season of the church's year, it is gentle, beautiful, full of family, music, saints and angels. We busy ourselves in preparation for meeting family and friends and expressing our love through gifts and being present to each other.

Sadly, as we know, the holy season of Advent has been squeezed into oblivion by commercialism – how many people really know, beyond buying a treat advent calendar, what this season means, or that it exists at all? Advent is about expectation, preparation and delayed gratification – things impossible to package and sell. But for us in the church Advent still has meaning – literally the word *Advent* means “The Coming” – at the beginning of Advent we remember and prepare for the second coming of Christ, when he will come in his glory, when the Kingdom, which at the moment is hidden and small, will be revealed.

We then enter the expectation of St. John the Baptist – a key figure of waiting and preparing. The man whose divine vocation was to wait, and point out the messiah when he comes.

Finally, we look to the birth of Jesus, the people and events around which he was born. We travel backwards, from the future kingdom, to the past, the birth of the King. All this prepares us for the great celebration of Christmas.

Can I gently encourage you, as much as possible, to remember Advent, to mark it, even as it is forgotten by the world. There are various ways we can do this – delaying as much as possible the putting up of decorations replaced perhaps by advent candles, fasting from something (it is a penitential season after all), by deciding to make a really good confession, keeping within ourselves an expectation and desire for Jesus to enter more fully our lives.

If we can hold on to Advent then Christmas itself becomes deeper, our rejoicing more heartfelt.

Fr Tom's Induction Mass

The induction of a new parish priest is very important for a parish – the episcopal vicar Canon Victor Darlington will lead Fr Tom in the profession of faith, and various promises for serving the parish, and then invite all the parishioners to pray, as well as ecumenical and social representatives who are present.

There may be 200 or so people in attendance, from various parishes Fr Tom has worked in, hopefully as many of our parishioners will be able to be present too. If you would be able to help provide food and drink for the reception in the school hall that would be greatly appreciated, sign up sheets can be found in the porch. The Mass will be next Saturday 6th December at 6pm.

Parish Restoration Update

After the amazing news of Andrew Carmichael's legacy, this is just a short update on the Parish Restoration Project. Great work has been done by our parish volunteers in uncovering the original church floor – this work will be completed after Christmas.

Fr Tom and Brian met with the conservation architect, the heritage advisor and the head of the Bishop's patrimony committee, to narrow down the focus of our first National Lottery bid to a few essential works – the preservation of the main stained glass, the roofs and guttering and the uncovering of the original ceiling. I will write more as the bid is written and submitted, so we all know what is happening. But for now, thank you for your prayers and support. Much needs to be done, but all things are possible with God.
