Spiritual Thought

Firstly, please let me say a huge thank you for your warm and generous welcome to me last weekend. Welcoming a new priest can be difficult, particularly after such a good and hard working priest such as Fr Kevin, who knows this parish and it's parishioners so well. So I do deeply appreciate the kindness of your welcome.

We celebrate today (replacing the Sunday of Ordinary Time) the feast of the Exultation of the Holy Cross. This feast commemorates the discovery of the true cross of Jesus by St. Helena (the mother of Emperor Constantine) in Jerusalem.

According to tradition three crosses were discovered, so the question arose as to which bore the savior, and which the thieves crucified with him. A miracle of healing showed which was the cross of Jesus, and from this cross all the relics of the True Cross have been taken – we have one such relic in our own church.

What can be learnt and lived from this ancient traditional story? There are many crosses in the world – the Romans loved using the cross for execution – there are many sufferings and causes of suffering. But there is only one life giving, saving cross. Only one cross sanctified by bearing the body of the Lord. Our lives can have suffering – some people suffer horrendously in body and mind – but our sufferings only become healing or meaningful when we unite them to the sufferings of the Lord.

When we consciously, intentionally offer our sufferings with His then our sufferings, our crosses, become fused to His – our sufferings then become part of His divine sacrifice, our sufferings help heal the sins of the world.

This is a profound truth – St. Paul himself claims "I am making up in my flesh what is still lacking from the sufferings of Christ" (Col. 1:24). We do the same when we suffer, and unite that suffering with Jesus on the cross.

May the prayers of St. Helena be with us, for our own healing, and the salvation and healing of the world.
