Spiritual Thought

This week on Wednesday we celebrate the feast day of one of the great saints of the church, St. Teresa of Avila, Doctor of the Church.

She joined the lax convent of the Incarnation in Avila, in Castile, and, by her own admission, was lax in her vocation. The nun there were allowed to furnish their rooms, have many visitors and talk freely – which separated the community socially and financially.

However, during a period of illness she discovered the practice of interior prayer – not the saying of prayers, but the opening of the heart and mind to God and the discovery of His presence in her soul.

This discovery completely changed her life. She, with some other sisters, left the Incarnation to found the convent of St Joseph. This convent emphasized deeper prayer, silence and poverty as ways to holiness.

In the course of her life she founded convents up and down Spain and was well known for her hard work, holiness and sense of humour. She gave us the expression “Lord, save us from sour faced saints”. Her writings are easily accessible, particularly the spiritual classic The Interior Castle – which I would recommend to anyone.

With the saints we might ask “what can we learn from them?” but with St Teresa we can ask “what can’t we learn from her?”

Her simple definition of prayer “If a person doesn’t think of Whom he is addressing, and of what he is asking for, and who it is that is asking and of Whom he is asking it, I do not consider that he is praying at all.” Prayer then, for St Teresa means being aware of God, who He is in his splendor and glory and divine love. And being aware of ourselves, who we are as we approach God.

With these thoughts, let us ask St Teresa to help us pray and enter more deeply into God’s mystery and life.
