Spiritual Thought

In being inducted (induced?) as Parish Priest is deeply meaningful. A priest is appointed, according to the law of the church, by receiving his letter of appointment “we hereby appoint you as parish priest ... given by my hand, this 1st September 2025” from his Bishop.

To make this moment of appointment more personal than a letter on the doormat, the church has given us a rite of induction – so that the priest has the duties explained to him, in front of everyone, so he can fulfill them.

The people of the parish too, have their instructions “You must be his fellow workers labouring in the vineyard of the Lord Jesus ... that as missionary disciples of the Lord Jesus, the church in this place may be a living sign of His presence amongst us.” Both the priest and the people are committed then to the building up and spiritually enriching the Kingdom of God. This mutual commitment is mutually uplifting – the priest not working alone, nor the flock directionless and lost.

One part of the rite of induction is very beautiful. The priest kneels and recites the Profession of Faith and Oath of Fidelity. These are an extended form of the Creed which we say at Mass, including the commitment to hold to these truths.

This can be very moving to hear. We know in principle that the priest believes the faith, we assume he does, we hope he does – but to hear him read alone the truths of our religion, and hear him commit himself to them has a particular power. It makes us remember that the priest is also a believer, while he may preside over a community, he is not above it, he is part of it – he too believes and he too worships. In this spirit of mutual responsibility and mutual faith I continue my priesthood here – I thank you for your prayers for me, your patience with me and your warm welcome to me.

Parish Restoration Update

After the amazing news of Andrew Carmichael's legacy, this is just a short update on the Parish Restoration Project. Great work has been done by our parish volunteers in uncovering the original church floor – this work will be completed after Christmas. Fr Tom and Brian met with the conservation architect, the heritage advisor and the head of the Bishop's patrimony committee, to narrow down the focus of our first National Lottery bid to a few essential works – the preservation of the main stained glass, the roofs and guttering and the uncovering of the original ceiling.

I will write more as the bid is written and submitted, so we all know what is happening. But for now, thank you for your prayers and support. Much needs to be done, but all things are possible with God.
