Spiritual Thought

Every week at the presbytery all those seeking adult confirmation or conversion to Catholicism meet to learn about the Catholic religion, our beliefs and practices. It's a wonderful moment for me as each week I have not merely to present some aspect of the faith – but open that aspect to the questions of others. Last week we were simply going through the order of the Mass (which can be found in the orange books beginning at page 7).

We are taken, at every Mass, on a journey. We are led by the ancient rhythm of the prayers.

Our first act at Mass happens even before the first hymn begins – we come together, at the same time in the same place, as the people of God. Gathering with us are the angels and the saints, and also all those we 'bring to Mass' with our prayers.

We confess our sins, recognising that deliberately or by habit we tend to push God away – but now we want to be close to Him.

And so He comes close – he speaks to us, through the sacred scripture, on the lips of the reader, God is speaking, instructing us, lifting us, reminding us of His works.

Our response to Him? "I believe in one God" – he has spoken and we believe. We are led from this belief, expressed in words to the lived belief in His true presence.

The bread and wine are placed on the altar, and by the words of Jesus, on the lips of the priest, they are changed into His precious body and blood. And are given to the faithful to receive, so we can be united with Him.

How fortunate we are to be taken on this journey each week, at each Mass. We arrive as mere individuals, and are gathered into one in the church – we are taken from disunity into profound unity, from separation to closeness – unity within the church and unity with God Himself. How fortunate we are to know that our worship brings God close, and unites us to Him.
