Spiritual Thought

Today we conclude the Christmas season – not with reference to Jesus’ birth, but with the new beginning of his ministry, his work for the people of God. For 30 years the Lord lived in Nazareth, indistinguishable from those around him. It wasn’t manifested that he was the only begotten Son of God, nothing extraordinary happened – this period is called his “hidden life” – when his glory and his message was hidden from the world and from those around him. Even this hidden life, however, is for our salvation. We say in the Creed “...for us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven...” – from the moment of his incarnation, his birth, his worship by the wise men, his hidden life – all is for our salvation. His obedience to his parents, his growing in human wisdom and understanding, his labour to earn money – all this is also for our salvation.

This is a beautiful mystery. It shows us that Jesus truly became one of us, just as he didn’t hold onto his heavenly glory, so he didn’t hold himself aloof from any human activity. He entered into friendships, worked, cooked, shared a family life – just as we do. And these things led him to experience personally our joys and our sorrows – because human emotion is wrapped up in our daily lives, in our daily relationships.

We say, because it is true, Jesus is true God and true man. True God we see in his miracles and teaching, and true Man we see in his living and loving with others.

Perhaps we like the idea that God is above us, far away from us. Perhaps there is comfort in that distance – that he can’t really see us clearly from so far away. No so! He has come very close, intimately close. He sees us and knows us, and understands us, because he has lived like us.

Reflecting on this mystery can be humbling, if the Lord of Glory has shared in the humblest of experiences, if he worked with his hands, served others, became vulnerable in family life and friendship can I do live like that? Can I serve others face to face, in a practical way? Can I become vulnerable to others, even vulnerable to God?

If so then we are one step to becoming more like Jesus, more like God.
