Just at the moment when we were anticipating a happy pilgrimage to the "Holy Land" the most terrible conflict has erupted, perhaps since the refoundation of Israel in 1948. I fear that it will not be possible to visit those sacred sites again in our lifetime. My Dad is now aged 97+. As a British Paratrooper, he was stationed in Israel/Palestine at the end of WW2, tasked with the job of trying to keep the peace. 80 years on he looks on in disbelief and despairs that matters are now worse than ever. One of the first things that commanded his attention when we arrived at OLSS, was the inscription beneath the familiar John Trinick window to the left of the Sacred Heart Chapel. It features Christ as a child in the carpenter's shop and asks us to:

Pray for the soul of Allan Ford aged 18! Here is his story...

Allan John Ford lived in Royal Hill. His mother died when he was a baby and he was raised by his paternal grandmother Mary-Ann. Alan attended our own St Ann's primary school and later St Joseph's Academy. He enjoyed Rugby and took an interest in the church. He left school in 1946 and went to work as a Clerk in a Wine & Spirit firm in Bermondsey. The family had a long history of naval and military service.

His Father John had served in the RN for 20 years and hoped his son would follow. Allan had been a member of the Sea Cadets and enjoyed great success in the *Greenwich Regatta* (!) but instead of the Navy, in May 1947, he joined the Palestinian Police signing up for Three Years. Within 10 weeks he was hospitalised. The armoured car in which he was travelling hit a land mine. He spent 12 days recovering from his wounds. On the day of his death, a large sum

of money was being transferred in a GMC armoured car from Barclays bank in Tel Aviv to the head office in Jerusalem. A strong party of terrorists had carefully planned a raid. A bank employee placed one sack of money in the vehicle, guarded by British Policemen. He was about to put a second when the gang converged on the scene from three directions and opened fire. Four British constables were killed and other police and civilians were injured. The machine gun in the turret was stolen from the armoured car. Smoke bombs were thrown and the attackers escaped leaving most of the cash. Four men were later interrogated. Allan and his 3 colleagues were buried the day after the attack with full honours, at Ramleh 12km Sth of Jaffa.

Shortly before the outbreak of these dreadful new hostilities, Maeve & Clive Paine made a quiet visit to Israel. They researched the story and went to find his grave at the Ramleh cemetery (above) leaving flowers on our behalf as well as



theirs. The grave is marked with the emblem of the Palestine Police and is inscribed:

> 1019 ALLAN JOHN FORD PALESTINE POLICE – KILLED IN THE GALLANT **EXECUTION OF DUTY ON**  $26^{\text{TH}}$  SEPTEMBER 1947 AGE 18. ETERNAL REST GIVE TO HIM O LORD AND LET PERPETUAL LIGHT SHINE UPON HIM MAY HE REST IN PEACE This is the month of the *Holy Souls*. This boy was just 18, today he would be on his "Gap Year"!


